

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

The mathematics curriculum aims to develop students' knowledge and understanding, providing them with key concepts and techniques while building a strong foundation for further study or practical application. It fosters problem-solving skills, encouraging the confident use of mathematics to address real-world and abstract challenges, and highlights its value in education, employment, and society. The curriculum also promotes enjoyment and confidence in mathematics by inspiring learners to apply techniques and concepts effectively, while enhancing reasoning and communication skills to present logical arguments, proofs, and conclusions.

Year of Assessment: Modular- Years 10 & 11, Linear- Year 11. Offered in June and November exam series

# **Subject Aims**

The subject aims to develop students' scientific knowledge and practical skills in biology, chemistry, and physics, fostering the ability to apply scientific principles to various contexts. It encourages the development of analytical and problem-solving skills in scientific scenarios, while also preparing students for further education in science and related fields. Additionally, the course aims to cultivate experimental and investigative skills based on correct and safe laboratory techniques.

**Year of Assessment:** Modular- Years 10 & 11. Offered in June and November exam series. In year 10, students will take the exams for units 1, 3 and 5. In year 11, they would take the exams for units 2, 4 and 6. With the option to retake any units from year 10 also.

#### Exam Structure

The qualification consists of six externally assessed written papers, one for each unit. All units are externally assessed. Students will achieve 2 IGCSE grades for this qualification.





The course encourages students to become more confident and skilled in various sports while developing transferable skills like numeracy and communication. The blend of scientific and social knowledge prepares students for further qualifications.

# **Subject Aims**

Students can work in areas such as drawing, installation, lens-light-based media, mixed media, land art, printing, painting, and sculpture. They will develop practical knowledge and understanding of using formal elements and visual communication through various approaches, employing observational skills to record and communicate ideas. Students will explore media characteristics, including wet, dry, malleable, resistant, and digital materials, and study the properties of colour and light, such as hue, tint, saturation, and tone. They will also learn to combine and manipulate two-dimensional and three-dimensional materials, as well as use digital and non-digital applications creatively.

#### **Qualification Structure**

#### Component 1: Personal Portfolio

Length: 120 guided learning hours

**Marks:** 72

#### Percentage: 60%

**Content:** This component allows students to develop and explore ideas, research primary and contextual sources, experiment with media, materials, techniques, and processes, and present personal responses to themes set by the school. The 120 guided learning hours will reflect its 60% weighting.

Students' work must include supporting studies and personal responses, showing evidence of all four Assessment Objectives. All work is internally set and marked, with a sample of work externally moderated by a moderator. Marks are submitted before moderation.

#### Component 2: Health and Performance

Length: -

Marks: 72

Percentage: 40%

**Content:** The Externally Set Assignment (ESA) marks the culmination of the Edexcel GCSE Art and Design course, drawing together all the knowledge, understanding, and skills developed in Component 1.

The ESA consists of one externally set, broad-based thematic starting point, developed through a series of suggested prompts. Students must produce a personal response to the ESA theme, which can be given to them as soon as it is released on 2nd January.

All work for component 1 and component 2 is internally assessed by the class teacher and externally moderated by the examination board.

# Subject Aims

The Pearson Edexcel IGCSE in Business helps students develop an interest in business, understanding key concepts, terminology, and objectives. They will learn how businesses are organised, financed, and operated, applying their knowledge to contemporary issues in various business types. The course also fosters critical-thinking and enquiry skills, enabling students to interpret business data and make informed judgements, while understanding the dynamics of business activity, ethics, and sustainability in a global context.

#### Year of Assessment: Year 11

#### Exam Structure -

#### Paper: Topic - Investigating small businesses

Length: 1 hour 30 minutes

**Marks:** 80

#### Percentage: 50%

**Content:** This paper will draw on topics taken from the whole of the subject content. The question scenarios are based on a small business – up to 49 employees.

The exam consists of four compulsory questions, each worth 20 marks – total of 80 marks in Paper 1. The sub-questions are a mixture of multiple-choice, short-answer, data-response and open-ended questions. Calculators may be used in the examination.

#### Paper: Topic - Investigating small businesses

Length: 1 hour and 30 minutes

**Marks:** 80

#### Percentage: 50%

**Content:** This paper will draw on topics taken from the whole of the subject content. The question scenarios are based on a large business – more than 250 employees. The make-up of the exam is consistent with paper 1.

# Additional Information

The course looks at the following topics:

**1 – Business Activity and Influences on Business:** This section covers business objectives, changing environments, and criteria for success, focusing on the importance of clear objectives and how the business environment affects them.

**2 – People in Business:** This section examines roles, relationships, and management within organisations.

**3 – Business Finance:** This section explores the use of financial information to aid decision-making.

**4 – Marketing**: This section focuses on identifying and satisfying customer needs in a competitive international environment.

**5 – Business Operations:** This section looks at how organisations use and manage resources to produce goods and services.

The course aims to enhance reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills, build confidence in using Arabic for everyday communication, and foster cultural awareness of Arabic-speaking communities.

Students will learn to express personal opinions, engage in discussions, and understand written and spoken texts. The course equips students with skills for further education or employment in Arabic-speaking contexts and prepares them for more advanced study. It emphasises practical language use in both social and formal situations, providing a solid foundation for future Arabic studies.

**Content:** Students are assessed on their ability to communicate effectively through writing in Arabic for different purposes and audiences. Students are required to produce responses of varying lengths and types to express ideas and opinions in Arabic. The instructions to students are in Arabic. Word counts are specified for each question. Students must answer all questions.
